

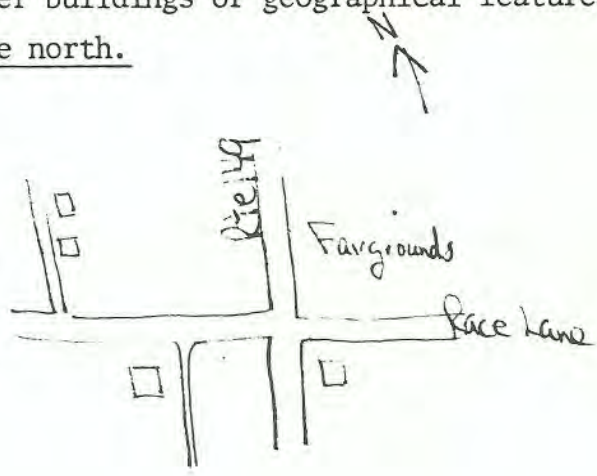

The former Barnstable County Fairgrounds is a large flat field which formerly had several permanent exhibit structures and a race track with grandstand. It is now a vacant field.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Discuss types of use, major period of use, evaluate importance within town.

The Barnstable County Fair was revived in 1954 after many years of inactivity. The fair, originally held in Barnstable Village, started under the auspices of the Barnstable County Agricultural Society in 1844. It increased in size and quality until 1920 when it started a period of decline and finally was ended in 1932. Its period of growth is well recorded on the County Atlases of 1880 and 1907. The revived fair was severely buffeted by hurricane winds in 1955. Fair goers stayed home and a financial loss resulted, but the fair continued the next year, offering interest and entertainment for all ages until 1973. The owners of the grounds did not wish to renew the rental contract so the fair was moved to Rte. 151 in North Falmouth.
