ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE of area. (Describe physical setting, general character, and architecturally significant structures).

The Plains, which is located in northern Marstons Mills, is characterized by extremely flat topography. It is of interest primarily for its 20th century development with the Cape Cod Airport and the Barnstable County Fairgrounds. It is also the location of the innovative "Ecology House" built underground in 9173.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE of area. (Explain development of area, what caused it, and how it affected community; be specific).

This area of Marstons Mills received the name The Plains or Hamlin's Plains due to the large tract of land owned by James Hamlin during the early settlement of Barnstable. This land is located to the north and east of the Indian Ponds: Mystic, Middle and Hamlin. Major Micah Hamlin of Revolutionary fame and Gen. Joseph Hamlin who fought in the Civil War were descendents of James. Several others of the Hamlin, also spelled Hamblin, Hamlen, Hamblen, family also settled in this area (see Barnstable County Atlases 1858, 1880). The land in the area is extremely flat which made it an ideal location for the Cape Cod Airport (MMC-23) and the Barnstable County Fairgrounds (MMC-22) during the 20th century. The "Ecology House" (MMC-24) is located across Race Lane from the airport. It was built underground and designed to meet the "ecological and finaancial needs of today". The Ecology House is the first of its kind to be constructed on Cape Cod.
