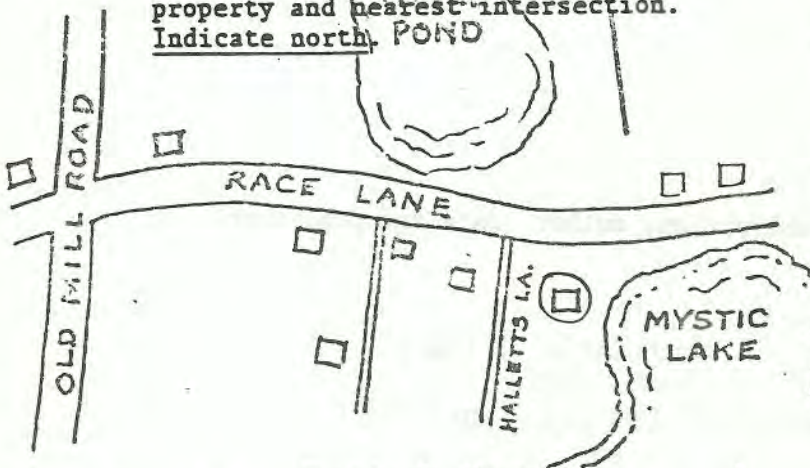

**ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE** (Describe important architectural features and

The Wright House is a half Cape cottage enclosed by a gable roof. Its side entry is framed by pilasters and headed by a transom. Windows are simply framed and contain 6/6 sash

**HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE** (Explain the role owners played in local or state  
history and how the building relates to the development of the community.)

This property is probably located on part of the 100 acres that Deacon William Crocker of West Barnstable willed to his grandsons in 1692. Capt. Benjamin Wright, Jr. (1804-1843) is listed as a shipmaster in the town records and local history books and was lost at sea in 1843. His brother William Wright survived a long and perilous experience after shipping out on a whaler (MMD-27). Captain Benjamin Wright, Jr. owned this property which is east of where his father once lived. It is on the south side of Race Lane along the north shore of Mystic Lake, one of the three Indian Ponds in Marston Mills.
